Details: The new Headley Grange cigar takes its name from the iconic British building where several rock bands recorded. “I wanted a cigar that tastes like the first six seconds of ‘When the Levee Breaks,’” said Jon Huber of Crowned Heads, describing the heavy drum beat that defines the intro to the song. The cigarmaker who makes Headley Grange for Crowned Heads, Ernesto Perez-Carrillo, is a former drummer, so he naturally took the suggestion in stride, creating a much darker, heavier cigar than what he had previously done for Four Kicks. Headley Grange cigars are powered by a core of all Nicaraguan tobaccos and wrapped in dark leaf of Ecuador Sumatra. In a somewhat unusual twist, only one size—the 5 1/2 by 52 Estupendo, \$9.25 retail—will ship next month, with the remaining four sizes coming in 2013.

What makes it special: This has to be the first cigar blended to match a drum track.
